Your support means so much, not only to us, but to the kids you are helping. You truly have helped us to make a difference and we thank you.

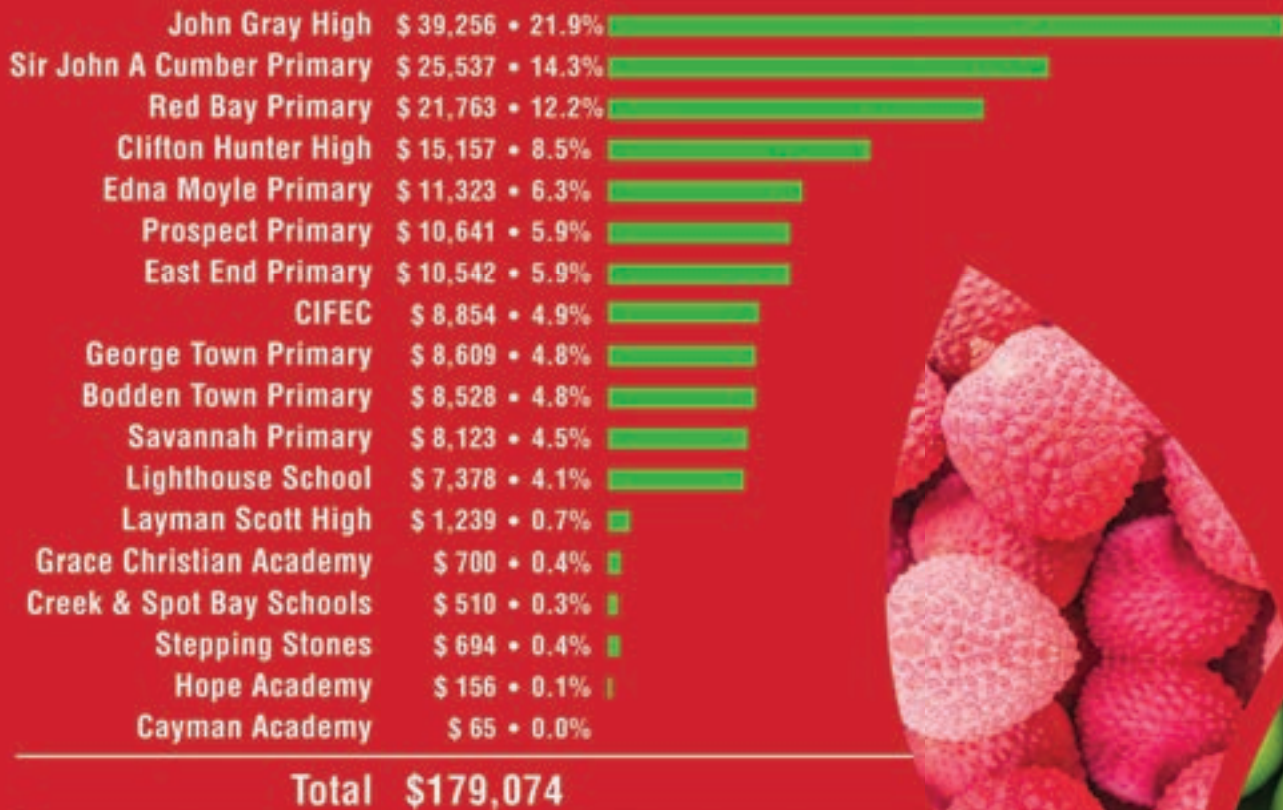

SUMMER MEALS

Established in 2014 “A Recipe for Summer” aims to bridge the gap that summer presents for those children who rely on a subsidised meal at school and over the 8 to 9 weeks of summer this programme reach extends up to 100 children. This food programme is designed to expose families to healthier food options and to equip them to cook, healthier foods for their children whilst fostering good habits related to the planning of meals and stretching the food available to them. The success of this programme is only possible through our partners in this initiative Foster’s Food Fair/IGA and Best Dressed Chicken.

FOOD SKILLS EDUCATION

Our first 'Cooking Matters' workshop was delivered in 2013 focused on healthy low-cost cooking. Annually we continue to offer educational and life skill workshops to the families we support inclusive of additional topics such as shopping smart, managing money, and sustainable eating.
