One highlight being that the pandemic has clarified the many strengths and assets of adequate and accessible school nutrition programmes.

We acknowledge and commend the recent decision taken by the leaders of our Country to provide free school meals to all primary school aged children in the Cayman Islands Public School system starting this school year.

We know that school feeding is a simple solution to tackling hunger and fulfills a basic human need where children spend most of their day and do most of their work.


We have long promoted that that our schools provide a safety net and as without food school is useless.

Whilst some may have apprehensions about this model we know from our ten years of experience supporting schools in this regard that this is the right thing to do. This decision will allow funds and resources to be allocated in ways that make the most impact whilst equaling the playing field.

Further, school feeding does not mean that the responsibility for feeding shifts from the parent or guardian to others. It simply means that our schools are a vested partner in and part of the community network ensuring that all children are fed and equipped to be healthy and learn.

Research shows that access to proper nutrition and healthy food is essential to all but critical to children, staring at a very young age.

Statistics shows the costs of health care increasingly rising in our country. It is a known fact that many adult onset diseases begin or manifest in childhood.

So the decision to incorporate free school meals is a very positive move and investment in our youth and country to do all we can to ensure the future success of our children.

From our point of view this is an investment at the front end to avoid later costs not only in poor academic and learning outcomes but in our youth's health and emotional and social well-being.

That said we remain committed to supporting our school communities and toward feeding our future in every way.

As we start the 2021/2022 school year our focus has been on the secondary student population having already enrolled 170 students.

Above this we continue to support all school communities through the steady supply of snacks and non-perishable food items, supplemental food support by way of dried goods or supermarket vouchers, delivery of nutritional workshops and opportunities for greater educational enrichment and outreach that may make a more lasting impact, breaking cycles, thereby supporting our children in being able to take advantage of the gains of our country through employment and advancement.


Our Board of Directors, Supporters and Volunteers
